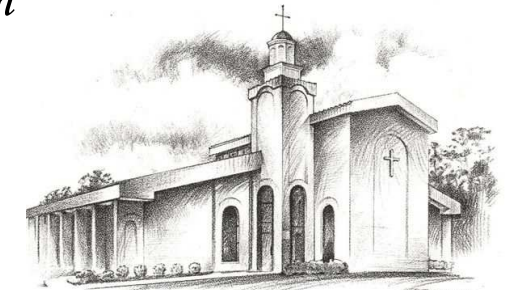

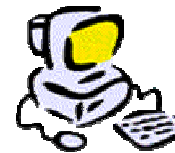

Norms for Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday, **February 22, 2012** and Good Friday, **April 6, 2012**, are days of fasting and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, Church law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the Parish Priest should be consulted.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and Catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Initiation into the Church or the renewal of Baptism Promises at Easter.

What YOU can do about the HHS Mandate

The recent ruling by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, mandating that contraceptives and abortifacients be included in all health care plans, even those offered by Catholic institutions, is a concern for Catholics. While this mandate challenges the teaching of the Church regarding love and life, the overriding question remains the challenge by the government to conscience rights and our Constitutional rights to religious liberty.

Bishop Burbidge has asked all the faithful in the Diocese to refer to our diocesan web site www.dioceseofraleigh.org in order to be kept current on the response of the Church regarding this matter. On our diocesan web site, you may find the following:
